ECD is a challenging illness that requires physicians across specialties to diagnose and treat patients. This disease, which is a type of slow-growing blood cancer, can affect the brain, bones, lungs, heart, and kidneys in dissimilar ways from patient to patient. Referral care centers provide the most up-to-date treatment available from doctors interested in helping ECD sufferers.

The ECDGA has facilitated the ECD Referral Care Center network since 2015. Including the new UAB care center, there are now 33 centers willing and able to treat ECD patients. These institutions are committed to having a team of specialists available to provide the best care to ECD patients. This network serves help ECD patients directly and will also work with a patient's local medical team. Patients and local doctors are urged to reach out to the contacts at these centers for help in diagnosing, treating, and monitoring ECD patients.

Erdheim-Chester Disease is an ultra-rare condition that is believed to be under diagnosed. It is considered a histiocytic neoplasm (type of blood cancer). The illness is characterized by the accumulation of histiocytes, cells that normally fight infections, in tissue and organs. The tissue and organs become dense and fibrotic due to the infiltration of the histiocytes and can lead to organ failure unless a successful treatment is found.
