ECD Global Alliance Is now accepting Letters of Intent for the Early Investigator Research Grant

LOIs must be submitted by October 2

Erdheim-Chester Disease Global Alliance is now accepting Letters of Intent (LOIs) for the 2023 \$50,000 Early Career Investigator grant. The ECD Global Alliance is interested in receiving LOIs for any study that has the potential to lead to an increase in knowledge to eventually help address unmet adult histiocytic patient needs, including those with Erdheim-Chester Disease. Since 2010, Erdheim-Chester Disease Global Alliance has awarded over \$1.2 million in research grants. This year the organization will award an Early Career Investigator up to \$50,000 for a two-year funding period. ECD Global Alliance defines Early Career Investigators as individuals who have yet to receive funding for the study of ECD previously and are within seven years of completing either a terminal research degree, medical residency, or equivalent. All qualified and interested Early Career Investigators are encouraged to submit a letter of intent. As appropriate, LOIs should consider including collaboration among investigators from different institutions, translation of findings into the clinical setting, and the use of data available in the ECD Registry housed at Memorial Sloan Kettering under the leadership of [Eli Diamond, MD](#).

[CAREGIVER RESOURCES](#)

Question: How does a patient navigator help caregivers?

Answer: One way the patient navigator helps caregivers is by providing resources.

Example tips provided to caregivers include:

- Make a list of all the tasks you need help with, and then list all the people who can help you (relatives, neighbors, friends, community resources). Ask for help.
- Look into local caregiver resources that can provide respite care at home or an adult day care facility.
- Look into home-delivered meal programs such as Meals on Wheels.

If you're wondering whether the term "caregiver" applies to you, it probably does. A caregiver is anyone who helps an aging, ill, or disabled family member or friend manage their day-to-day lives.

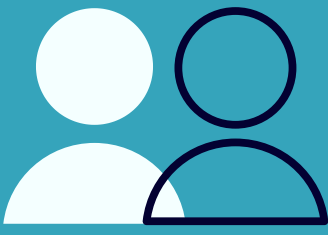
ECD CARE CENTER NETWORK

Petition for Approved Treatment in Japan



Although treatment has come a long way for hematological cancers, the newer, targeted therapies are not accessible to patients with histiocytic diseases in many countries, such as Japan. Through collaboration between the ECD Global Alliance, Japan LCH (Langerhans Cell Histiocytosis) Patient Association, Japan LCH Study Group, and the Histiocytosis Association, a petition has been put into motion to approve targeted agents for histiocytosis in Japan, giving ECD and other histiocytic patients hope that these treatments might become accessible to them.

Patient Representatives (two ECD patients and one father of a pediatric LCH patient) and directors of the Japan LCH Patient Association joined in a meeting with the Ministry of Health, Labour, and Welfare (MHLW) to request that BRAF / MEK inhibitors be approved and covered for histiocytosis. Members of the Japanese House of Representatives and a member of the Gunma Prefecture House of Representatives helped coordinate the meeting. Armed with petitions and supporting material, the Japan LCH Patient Association moved to have these targeted therapies approved for the treatment of histiocytic diseases, given the drugs already have an orphan classification and are currently recommended for this use in other countries.

Working together, ECD patients and partners brought significant attention to the need to make these life-changing treatments available to Japanese patients.

BIRTHDAY SURPRISE

Earlier this month, the ECDGA team got quite the surprise. As Ekta Patel celebrated her birthday, she decided to put together a Facebook Fundraiser with ECDGA as the beneficiary.

Unfortunately, Ekta lost her mother to ECD and she wanted to use this fundraiser to not only honor her memory but to spread awareness to her friends and family on what this disease is truly like. As a rare disease, patients not only struggle (often years) before reaching a diagnosis, but once they have those answers, treatment is limited and sometimes just out of reach, depending on insurance coverage and cost. With a goal of \$1,000, Ekta asked people to contribute what they could, and the support she got was mind-blowing. At the conclusion of Ekta's fundraiser, she DOUBLED her initial goal, with the total reaching just shy of \$2,200.

The ECDGA is humbled and honored to be the recipient of this gift and will use it to further both research and awareness for ECD as we continue to support all those affected by Erdheim-Chester Disease.
